- \* Close the chimney flue when you're not burning a fire - or expecting a rooftop visit from St. Nick! Leaving the flue open is the same as leaving open a window on a frosty night.

- \* Put holiday lights on a timer so they turn themselves off at bedtime and save you the trouble of braving the elements every night or forgetting and leaving them on throughout the night.

- \* If you're giving a computer or appliance as a gift this year, choose one that sports an EnergyStar label. That's the government's seal of approval for energy-efficient appliances.

- \* Don't let your holiday house-guests wake up chilly. Before

they arrive, trade your old thermostat for a programmable one that turns itself down a few degrees at bedtime and

back up just before the alarm clock rings.

- \* If you're cooking a turkey, there's no need to

preheat the oven, even if your recipe calls for it.

- \* Bake several items at once to save energy in the oven; just make sure you leave enough room for the heat to circulate around each casserole dish or pie plate.

- \* It's easy to keep your refrigerator and freezer full of scrumptious holiday treats; it's also energy efficient.

- \* And remember, don't run the dishwasher until it's full.
